

UNIFORM & EQUIPMENT POLICY

EFFECTIVE AS AT 15TH SEPT 2023

INTRODUCTION

The Baseball WA Uniform & Equipment Policy is endorsed by the Board of Directors of Baseball WA and provides further information to WA Representative Teams, Program Based Teams and Charters.

Amendments may be made by the Board of Directors of Baseball WA from time to time as required that potentially sit outside of this policy. It is expected that these changes would be timely (e.g. safety) and would be included in future versions of this policy document.

WA BASED TEAMS - LOCAL COMPETITIONS

- All uniforms for the State based competitions must be approved by the relevant competition department of Baseball WA.
- State League Teams MUST have 2 separate playing uniforms to ensure they do not clash with the HOME teams uniform.

WA REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

- All players must wear uniforms as issued by Baseball WA.
- Subject to a supplier agreement being met between Baseball WA and a supplier, players must wear equipment that is of an approved safety standard as agreed by Baseball WA at its sole discretion.
- Any items of uniform or equipment that carry motifs or logos must be approved by Baseball WA at its sole discretion.
- A player's shirt number shall be either one or two digits.
- Baseball WA may display its State Logo once on each item of supplied uniform and equipment.
- Any Commercial Logo on clothing shall be decided by Baseball WA and shall be common to and worn by every member of the team concerned.
- No individual Commercial Logos shall be worn by any team member.


FEMALE UNIFORMS

 Female players that are playing in a FEMALE ONLY Competition and/or Program where all players are under the Age of 17 years MUST wear black pants.

CHARTER UNIFORMS

- The style guide shall at all times be a reflection of the BWA approved range board for each charter.
- Where items are sought that are not part of the generic BWA range, charters can seek BWA
 permission to have these produced. If such product is deemed appropriate by BWA, BWA will
 forward the request to its contracted suppliers for quoting. Should the contracted supplier not be
 able to supply, the charter can seek BWA permission to source externally with any final product and
 associated artwork / design to be sent to BWA for approval prior to manufacture.
- Players and coaches shall purchase their uniform top and cap.
- Any garment worn on the diamond or in the dugout during a game (i.e., does not include during
 warm up prior to the game) must only wear LLWA-branded apparel from the charter's range. Other
 garments that do not display the LLWA logo are not permitted on the diamond or in the dugout
 from the first pitch to the last pitch unless the LLDA has granted an exemption.
- Coaches of Little League age divisions must be dressed in the coach polo and shorts/slacks.
- Coaches of all other age divisions have the option of a coach polo (to be worn with shorts) or uniform top (to be worn with team baseball pants only).
- All coaches in the same team must be dressed in the same uniform combination i.e., all wearing coach polo or all wearing full uniform.
- EOs must not wear the coach polo or playing jersey and should only wear the training tee or supporter polo bearing the LLWA logo.
- Baseball uniforms including but not restricted to uniform tops, coach polos, caps and training tees
 will be manufactured by Baseball WA's suppliers for all teams (other than Minor League-MP). Charter
 ADAs shall ensure orders for their teams are placed using the advised process by the due date each
 year.
- Players and coaches shall purchase their uniform top and cap.
- Charters shall determine the colour of baseball pants their team is to use however must either be grey or white (subject to the provisions relating to girls-only teams). All pants must be uniform in design and belts must be consistent in colour with approved team colours. Note: club teams participating in the Minor League (MP60) may wear their regular club pants regardless of colour.

- Baseball caps are considered part of the playing uniform and must be worn by all coaches and players at all times during a game unless where substituted by a protective helmet.
- Batting Helmets are considered part of the team uniform and must be consistent in colour with the team uniform. Charter committees are required to provide six (6) helmets for each of their teams.
